Father's Day Jar Craft

(Duration of actvity -15-30 minutes)



SUPPLIES FOR MASON JAR BANK

Oil based Sharpie paint markers

Mason Jar (with lid) or any jar with a lid

Tape or Stickers to assist with the colouring (with the sharpie pens)

DIRECTIONS HOW TO MAKE MASON JAR BANK

1. It is always best to have a nice clean surface to start any project. Clean the jar with a <u>glass</u> <u>cleaner</u> or alcohol wipe.

2. Tape off the shape of a tie with masking tape or painters tape or just eye ball it.

3. Colour in the tie, allow to dry for 30mins before you add additional colours for the tie. The oil based marker colours will bleed together, so make sure the colours compliment each other. Be very careful not to get on clothes. Once the painted tie is complete, remove the tape.

- 4. You can add a few words to the side like #1 Dad and/ or Best Dad. There is a second example of another jar which shows Dad's Stash ("Stache"). Really, anything you think dad will like, will be a great idea for this gift.
- 5. Once it is all dry, fill up the jar with dad's favourite items e.g. favourite little snacks, spare coins , nuts and bolts..... etc. and screw on the jar lid.

Father's Day Sun catcher Craft - Best Gamer Dad (parental help /supervision required)

(Duration of activity 1-1.5 hours required.)



I have included the template as an attachment. Please print out and trace on cardstock / cereal box. (see below)

Materials required:-

Black cardstock (I used an empty cereal box and black sharpie pen to colour in) Tissue paper in various colours or cellophane or see through ribbons Clear Contact paper Pen knife (make sure you can use it or know how to use it safely , ask your parents) Hole puncher Scissors

Method:-



Print the template and transfer the design across by drawing onto card stock with the black sharpie marker pen. Cut out shape with scissors.



Use the pen knife (make sure it is OK with mum) and cut out the uncoloured parts (non-black part) and check that you have a cutting board behind your template to avoid damaging the table!



Colour the other side with sharpie pen so it looks good on both sides.



I found some cellophane and ribbons in the cupboard so they have come in very handy for this project. Cut these into various shapes.

I placed glue on the underside of the template and stuck the bits of ribbon and cellophane on, as shown above. Looking great!



Cut one sheet of contact paper out and place on the underside, then place the rest of the ribbons and cellophane on the sticky surface of the contact. (you do not require glue here).

When you are happy with what it looks like, cut out another sheet of contact and place the sticky side down on the right side of the template to finish off, basically sealing the template up.

To be able to hang it up you will need to punch a hole at the top (as shown above) and thread a ribbon through.
